- 1. Open a browser and go to www.geogebra.org. Once you're there search for exploding dots.
- 2. Click on the first link, the explodint dots book. Then click on Exploding Dots Apps on the left.
- 3. Try a few numbers in the $1 \leftarrow 2$ and $1 \leftarrow 3$ machine.
- 4. Now let's look at the $2 \leftarrow 3$ machine. What "base" does this represent? Fill in the chart below using the applet and your own machine.
